GREEN HOME, HEALTH AND SAFETY FAIR JULY 29!

The City of Frisco will be holding its 11th Annual Green Home, Health and Safety Fair at Centennial High School this **Saturday, July 29th from 9 am to 1 pm**. This is a great public education/awareness event that will benefit all that attend.

The Green Home, Health and Safety Fair is one of our National Night Out kick-off events and will be held in conjunction with the National Night Out Police, Fire and Military Car Show in addition to the "Don't Mess with Texas" Trash & Treasure Hunt and Frisco Parks & Recreation Wiffle Ball Derby. Canned food donations will also be accepted on behalf of Frisco Family Services Center. The car show (sponsored by the Frisco Citizens' Police Academy Alumni Association and Frisco Citizens on Patrol) will feature specialized public-safety/military vehicles, helicopters and displays. Specialized vehicles from the US Secret Service and FBI will be featured at this show as well.

The Health and Safety portion of the fair is designed to promote public-safety, education, and health within the community. There will be representatives from local agencies/organizations including Centennial Medical Center, Collin County Homeland Security and SPCA of Texas just to name a few. The Department of Public Safety will be on hand with their mobile driver's license unit doing onsite driver's license renewals.

The Green Home portion of the fair will feature building science demonstration models, information about Green Building & Energy Star appliances, energy efficient building materials, and pollution-free electrical services. There will also be displays of alternative fuel and hybrid technologies, with hybrid vehicles from area dealerships and hands-on demonstrations.

During the fair there will also be a blood drive sponsored by the Frisco Police and Fire Departments. The blood drive is conducted by Carter Blood Care and includes a free cholesterol test. Appointment times begin at 9:00 and are available every fifteen minutes. While it is preferred that an appointment is made, walk-ups are certainly welcome.

There will also be plenty for the kids to see and do with planned activities to include bounce houses, clowns, robots, face painters, etc. Most of the event is indoors (air conditioned!) and there will be food vendors on hand as well.

• **Clubhouse Staff** – The board is currently working with the clubhouse staff to make sure that the office and events are covered with adequate staff and that all events are scheduled so that there is proper coverage. This will be an ongoing process and will include some changes to the staff and rental procedures as we figure out how to best manage this process.

• **Trash at the Pools** – The board has approved two additional trash services at the pool area during the summer months. The two additional services will be on Saturday and on Sunday and will help to control the amount of trash that accumulates at the pool area during high-traffic days. Please dispose of your trash; it takes just a few seconds to pick up your own trash.

• **Dog Poop Signage** – The board approved the purchase and installation of signage around the common areas to remind homeowners of the need to clean up after their pets.

The HOA Board and committees need your help. If there are items you are interested in seeing improved or addressed, please join a committee. Volunteers are needed to research the costs for solutions so the board can determine how to best prioritize improvement projects. Pool Wise... Healthy Swimming

Did you know that the community pool has been closed twice this year due to contamination? Each time the pool is contaminated, it must be closed. This includes contacting the pool service so that the area can be cleaned and treated with chemicals, and then reopened. This process takes starts after a 24-hour waiting period. Each incident costs the HOA \$350.00, and as a result could cause your HOA dues to increase. The pool is usually closed for one day, causing an inconvenience to the neighborhood, especially during weekends.

Here are some facts from the Centers for Disease Control about Recreational Water Illness and how to control and prevent them.

Did you know that germs can contaminate swimming water even if it is treated with chlorine? Learning about recreational water illnesses (RWIs), which are spread by swimming in contaminated recreational waters such as swimming pools, waterparks, lakes, and the ocean, can protect you from illness.

RWIs are caused by germs like "Crypto" (KRIP-toe, short for Cryptosporidium), Giardia (gee-ARE-dee-uh), E. coli 0157:H7, and Shigella (Shi-GE-luh) and are spread by accidentally swallowing water that has been contaminated with fecal matter.

How does a pool get contaminated? You share the water with everyone in the pool. If someone with diarrhea contaminates the water, swallowing the water can make you sick.

The good news is that germs causing RWIs are killed by chlorine. However, chlorine doesn't work right away. It takes time to kill germs and some germs like "Crypto" are resistant to chlorine and can live in pools for days. That is why even the best maintained pools can spread

Tips on Making Changes to your Home

Did you know that all changes to the exterior of your home must be submitted and approved by the Architectural Control Committee (ACC)?

Examples of items that must be approved include: changing your home's paint color, staining your fence, adding landscape retaining walls, swimming pools, and sheds / playscapes.

The approval process is simple and takes less than 30 days to complete. Log on to heritagelakes-hoa.org and

illness. Therefore, Healthy Swimming behaviors are needed to protect you and your kids from RWIs and will help stop germs from getting in the pool in the first place.

Six Tips for Healthy Swimming

1. PLEASE don't swim when you have diarrhea. This is especially important for kids in diapers. You can spread germs in the water and make other people sick.
2. PLEASE don't swallow the pool water. In fact, avoid getting water in your mouth.
3. PLEASE practice good hygiene. Take a shower before swimming and wash your hands after using the toilet or changing diapers. Germs on your body end up in the water.
4. PLEASE take your kids on bathroom breaks or change diapers often. Waiting to hear "I have to go" may mean that it's too late.
5. PLEASE change diapers in a bathroom and not at poolside. Germs can spread to surfaces and objects in and around the pool and spread illness.
6. PLEASE wash your child (especially the rear-end) thoroughly with soap and water before swimming. Everyone has invisible amounts of fecal matter that end up in the pool.

Focus on Frisco

New Leases at Hall Office Park

- Hall Financial Group announced this week that:
- San Francisco, CA-based Levi Strauss & Co. has signed a new lease for 24,898 square feet at 2601 Network Boulevard, a six-story, 150,000 square foot Class A office building, in Hall Office Park.
- Principal Management Group, a recognized leader in the management of community associations in North Texas, has leased 4,920 square feet at 3211 Internet Boulevard, Suite 370, in Hall Office Park.
- Bolinger & Hogue, LLP, a law firm that practices estate, tax, business, asset protection and charitable planning, probate and guardianship law, has leased 2,816 square feet at 2595 Dallas Parkway, Suite 100, in Hall Office Park.
- AOS Engineering, LLC, a MEP engineering consulting firm, has leased 1,993 square feet at 3211 Internet Boulevard, Suite 260, in Hall Office Park.
- Enterprise Staffing Group, a staffing and consulting firm, has leased 1,321 square feet at 2801 Network Boulevard, Suite 507, in Hall Office Park.

Frisco Square Retail Development

So far, Frisco Square has had more success with residential and office than retail.

But Brant Bryan, a partner in Fairways Frisco L.P., says office and residential demand has shot up in the last year and he expects retail to follow. About 51,600 square feet of office space is almost 100% leased and 114 apartments are about 98% leased.

The project's 40,000 square feet of retail is about 60% occupied.

"There are enough things going on with City Hall and Pizza Hut Park, office and residential demand, that (retail) is going to have critical mass pretty quickly," Bryan said.

In addition to the theater, Frisco Square signed Mattito's Tex Mex restaurant. It is in lease negotiations with Starbucks, an ice cream shop and a diner. And it is in talks with a few fitness center tenants and specialty grocers.

When it opens next week, City Hall will bring in about 200 employees and 500 visitors a day, said Ross Golman, of Dallas-based The Retail Connection, who is handling leasing for the center.

But the expected September 2007 Dallas North Tollway completion, which will link State Highway 121 with

U.S. 380, will usher in far greater changes, Golman said.

"By September of '07 there will be a lot of traffic and a lot more density of retail and restaurants," he said.

Frisco Family Services 2006 School Supply Program

With a median household income of over \$80,000 per year, it's difficult to remember that a city like Frisco has about 400 children whose families cannot give them the necessary school supplies or clothing for this next school year. Families may be in these unfortunate circumstances due to a crisis and/or have limited or no income. Frisco Family Services has a program in place to provide these children with what they need.
